New Annual Meeting Date

Feeling Out of the Loop?

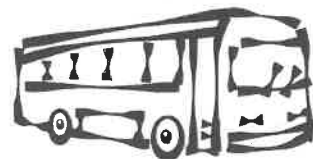

Board of Directors Meeting, September 1

The board moved its August meeting to September 1. It also held its normally scheduled September meeting plus an additional meeting in September to discuss the 2010 budget. For more information about the board schedule and meeting minutes, go to www.cameronstation.org.

Financial Report

As of July 31, the HOA held \$2,318,739.03 in cash and investments. Year-to-date income was \$1,624,190.46 versus expenses of \$1,244,182.81, resulting in a year-to-date surplus of \$380,007.65. Accrued reserves stood at \$1,324,528.73 and were fully supported by cash and investments indicating that the HOA is in a healthy financial position. Delinquent dues were 2.9%, below the industry standard of 5%.

Police Report

Deputy Chief Blaine Corle told the board that there had been only one theft reported recently in the community, which occurred between two employees of the daycare center.

A resident again raised strong concerns about traffic around Samuel Tucker Elementary School and the danger it poses, particularly to parents walking children to school in the mornings. She said that traffic coming in from outside the community to drop off students is backing up, causing some motorists to pull around traffic lines into oncoming traffic lanes. Deputy Chief Corle said that he had recently noticed that there are no "School Zone" signs in the area and he would see to it that some were installed. He said that he would assign officers to monitor the area in the mornings to identify other ways to address the problem.

Ad-Hoc Cameron Club Renovation Committee

Committee Chairperson Martin Menez reported to the board that input on the potential renovation of the club was received at the recent Town Hall Meeting. The committee has been working on a community survey and will be circulating a draft to the Cameron Club & Events Committee, then to the board. He discussed the challenges in obtaining accurate and adequate data about club usage for the study; while some data was readily available, steps would need to be taken on a temporary basis to help fill in the gaps. The board authorized a two-month period of additional data-gathering about the number of people using the basketball court and attending exercise classes and private functions at the club. The board acknowledged that it is impractical and too costly to monitor everyone who enters the facility for any reason, so some usage estimates will be necessary.

Temporary Fitness Center Closure

The board approved closure of the Fitness Center on Thursday, October 1 - Friday, October 2 for cleaning, painting and equipment-moving. The closure will begin at 9am to enable early morning usage on October 1 and re-open at 5pm on October 2 to permit evening usage.

Also, regarding the Fitness Center, new treadmills were to be replaced the following day. Two 7.5 lb dumbbells were stolen and will be replaced.

Ben Brenman Park

Board member Mindy Lyle reported that representatives of the city's Parks and Recreation department and Councilman Rob Krupicka met with residents of Sommerville Street to discuss plans to install new lighting and artificial turf for ballfields in Ben Brenman Park. The city plans to take a group of the residents to Fort Ward Park to show them the lighting system there, which is the same as would be installed in Brenman Park. She also noted that if the city goes through with its plans, more city staff will need to be assigned to the park until it closes to ensure that users leave.

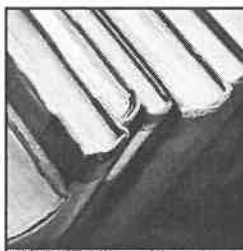
Please Trim Your Trees

of all types. A huge success and a reminder that every little bit helps.

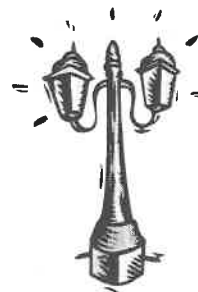
Community-Wide Autumn Yard Sale

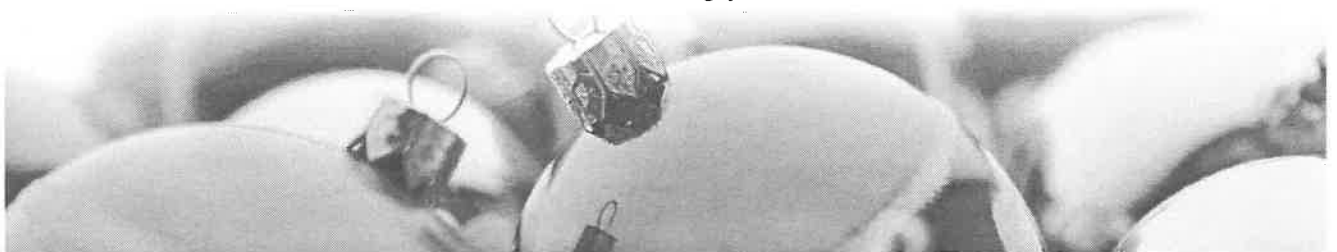

City of Alexandria residents may dispose of household hazardous waste such as leftover paint, cleaning solvent and other hazardous household materials safely, conveniently and at no cost through the Household Waste Facility, 3600 Wheeler Ave. The facility is open Mondays and Saturdays (except holidays) from 7:30am to 3:30pm. The facility is available to city residents only; photo identification will be required to prove residency at time of drop-off. The city also accepts computers, televisions, VCRs, printers, stereos, cellular phones and many other types of electronics at this site. (No appliances, including air conditioners, dehumidifiers, microwaves, etc., are accepted.)

Trash Removal Restrictions

Due to landfill regulations, the following items will NOT be collected with regular trash: dead animals, oil, paint, stains or other liquids, batteries, construction or remodeling material, manure, tree stumps, mulch, sod, dirt, stone, rocks, cement, bricks, poisons, dangerous acids, caustics, explosives or other dangerous material, or items too large or heavy to be loaded safely in collection vehicles by refuse collectors.

The above items may be taken to the Alexandria Waste Facility.

Summer is over, and the hordes of relatives and friends who came to visit you and see the sights have gone home. Now you can relax!

Or not.

Summer may be prime tourist season in the nation's capital, but for those in the know, fall is an even better time to visit, because the crowds are down and the temperatures are, too. So the houseguests...they just keep on coming.

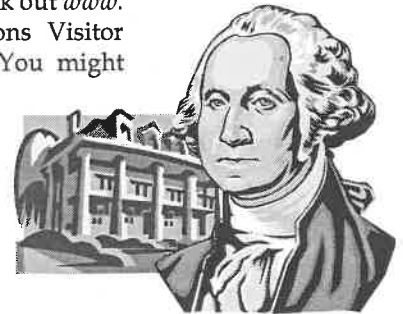
What to do if you can't stand to conduct one more tour of Washington's monuments and museums? If you can't take another Metro ride into DC, no matter how quick and easy the trip? If you can't look at one more rocket at the Air and Space Museum, or study one more dinosaur at Natural History, or climb one more step of the Washington Monument, no matter how short the lines may now be?

Well, we have a suggestion. Many of us probably didn't realize that there are lots of wonderful attractions just a short distance away in neighboring Fairfax County. Former Cameron Station resident Sue Porter, Director of Visitor Services for the county, has a wealth of information about places to visit throughout the year. There are historic attractions like Mount Vernon Estate and Gardens (which has a spectacular new orientation and education center) George Washington's Distillery and Grist Mill (where you can see demonstrations of the materials and machinery as they were originally used), Gunston Hall (home of George

Mason, father of the Bill of Rights) and Woodlawn (home of Martha Washington's granddaughter, Nelly Custis).

For something more modern, the Pope-Leighy house, which was designed by famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright, is a classic example of Usonian architecture. There are two railroad museums, a firearms museum, two working farms (one a reconstructed Revolutionary War farm worked with eighteenth century tools and methods and one a working demonstration farm of the 1930s), a 30-acre zoo, golf courses, lakes, parks, hiking trails...the list goes on and on. And of course, Fairfax boasts the fabulous Wolf Trap National Park for the Performing Arts; and for those who haven't seen enough airplanes and space artifacts, the huge Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum Udvar-Hazy Center is located near Dulles Airport.

You might also send your relatives and friends to the Visitor Center at Tyson's Corner Center, or stop by yourself while shopping, and pick up brochures on activities held throughout the year. 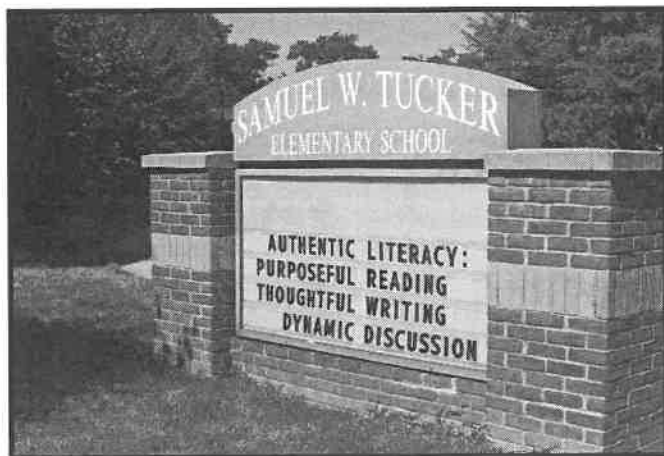
Tucker Elementary International Fall Festival Is Looking for You!
